

Impact of Pupil Premium Spend 2013/14

In January 2015 the school received a letter from David Laws MP congratulating the school on the progress over several years of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium. Because of this impact the school had been shortlisted for an award.

Analysis

Progress

As many or more of the Pupil Premium children at Rosehill have made expected progress than Non Pupil Premium children in reading and writing, and only slightly fewer in maths.

As many or more of the Pupil Premium children at Rosehill have made better than expected progress than Non Pupil Premium children in reading and writing, and only slightly less fewer in maths.

Attainment

More PP pupils have achieved level 4 in writing and maths than Non PP Pupils and only slightly fewer in reading.

We recognise that a gap still remains at the higher levels and we continue to work to close this.

Analysis

Although the percentage of pupils reaching Level 2 is slightly less for PP Pupils than Non PP pupils the progress that the pupils made within the year was excellent and was better than the NPP pupils in almost every category. This means that the gap between PP Pupils and non PP pupils in Y2 has narrowed.

(NB The cohort included 5 SEN pupils of whom 4 were PP)

Attendance

Attendance in 2013/14 improved from 94.7 to 96.3%
