### Analysis

The deployment of an additional Teaching Assistant to work with this cohort from Year 5 and into Year 6 has had a significant impact on the Key Stage 2 results

### Progress

The pupil premium pupils at Rosehill made almost as much progress in all three subjects from KS1 to KS 2 than the national average for all pupils not eligible for Pupil Premium

Also, more pupils made accelerated progress from KS1 to the end of KS2 in reading and in writing than did non eligible pupils nationally.

### Attainment

At the end of KS2 the percentage of pupils at Rosehill, who were eligible for Pupil Premium who achieved the expected standard (Level 4) was the same as non-pupil premium pupils nationally in reading and in writing.

In maths it was almost the same

Not as many Pupil Premium Pupils at Rosehill achieved Level 5 as non Pupil Premium pupils nationally but the gap is closing.in all subjects apart from writing.

### **Analysis**

At the end of KS1 more pupil premium pupils achieved the expected level (level 2 or above) than did non pupil premium pupils nationally. The percentage of pupil premium pupils achieving the higher level (Level 3) was the same or nearly the same as non-pupil premium pupil nationally in reading and writing. There remains a small gap in maths.
